The West Footscray Roosters Junior Football Club acknowledges the valuable contribution made by our volunteers and we encourage their active participating in providing a safe, fair and inclusive environment for all participants.

We want children to be safe, happy and empowered.

We support and respect all children, as well as our staff and volunteers.

We are committed to the safety, participation and empowerment of all children.

We have zero tolerance of child abuse, and all allegations and safety concerns will be treated very seriously and consistently with our robust policies and procedures.

We have legal and moral obligations to contact authorities when we are worried about a child's safety, which we follow rigorously.

The West Footscray Roosters Junior Football Club has recruitment practices to reduce the risk of child abuse by new and existing volunteers.

The West Footscray Roosters Junior Football Club committed to regularly training and educating our members, coaches, managers and volunteers on child abuse risks.

We are committed to the cultural safety of Aboriginal children, the cultural safety of children from culturally and/or linguistically diverse backgrounds, and to providing a safe environment for children with a disability.

We have specific policies and procedures in place that support our committee members and volunteers to achieve these commitments.
